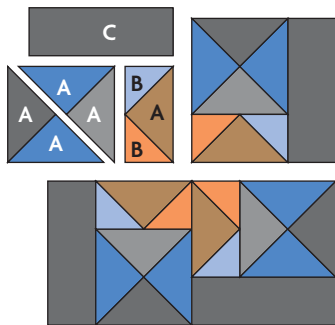


# Flying Dutchman

## 12" BLOCK

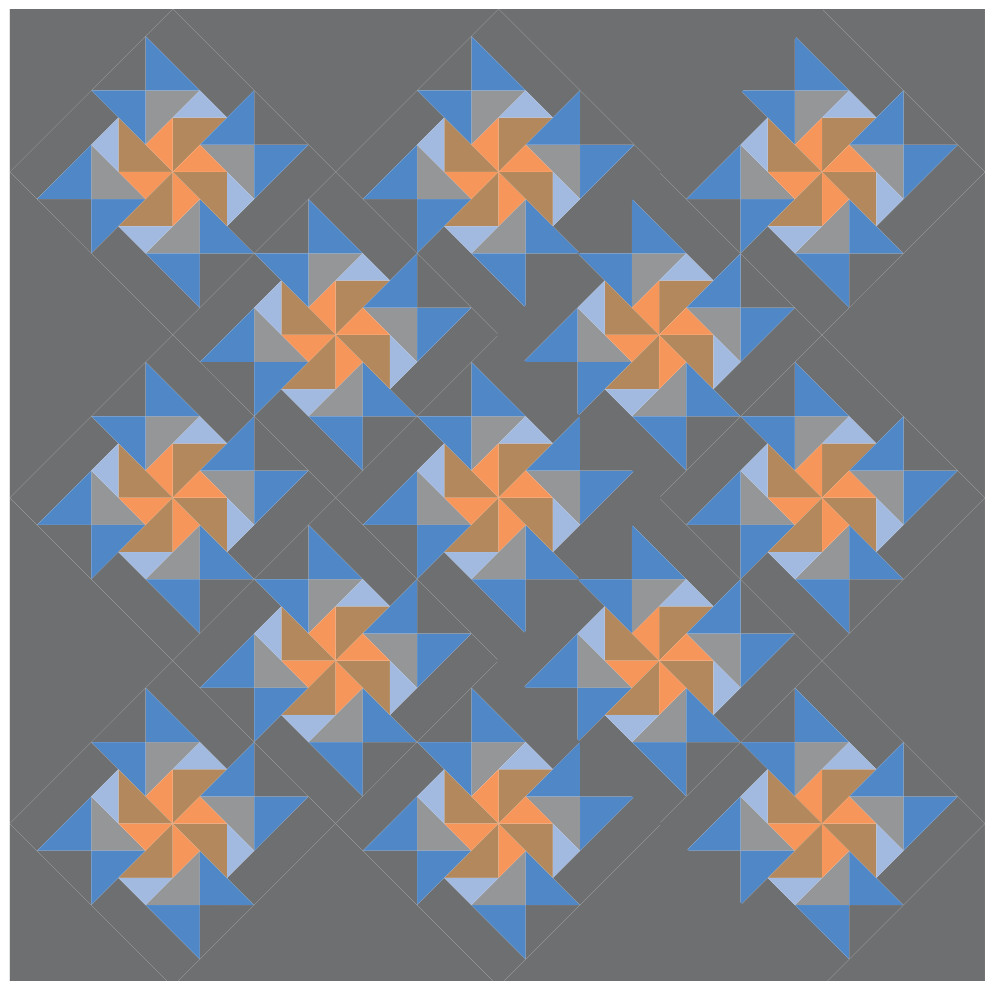
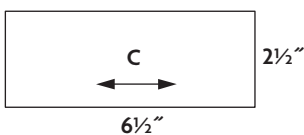
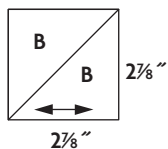
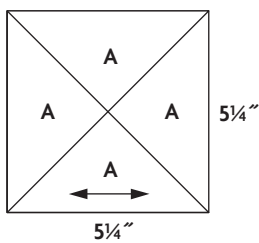
The first publication of the Flying Dutchman block was by the Ladies' Art company in the late 1800s. Though the pattern was traditionally made in blue and white, the design would work well in any color scheme. The pictured block is made with the Boro collection by Parson Gray for FreeSpirit Fabrics. Use the same fabric in the outermost A's and C's to get the look of triangles swirling against a background when the blocks are placed next to one another.



**BLOCK PIECING**

### ROTARY CUTTING

Measurements include 1/4" seam allowances. Align arrows with lengthwise or crosswise grain of fabric.



**SUGGESTED SETTING**
