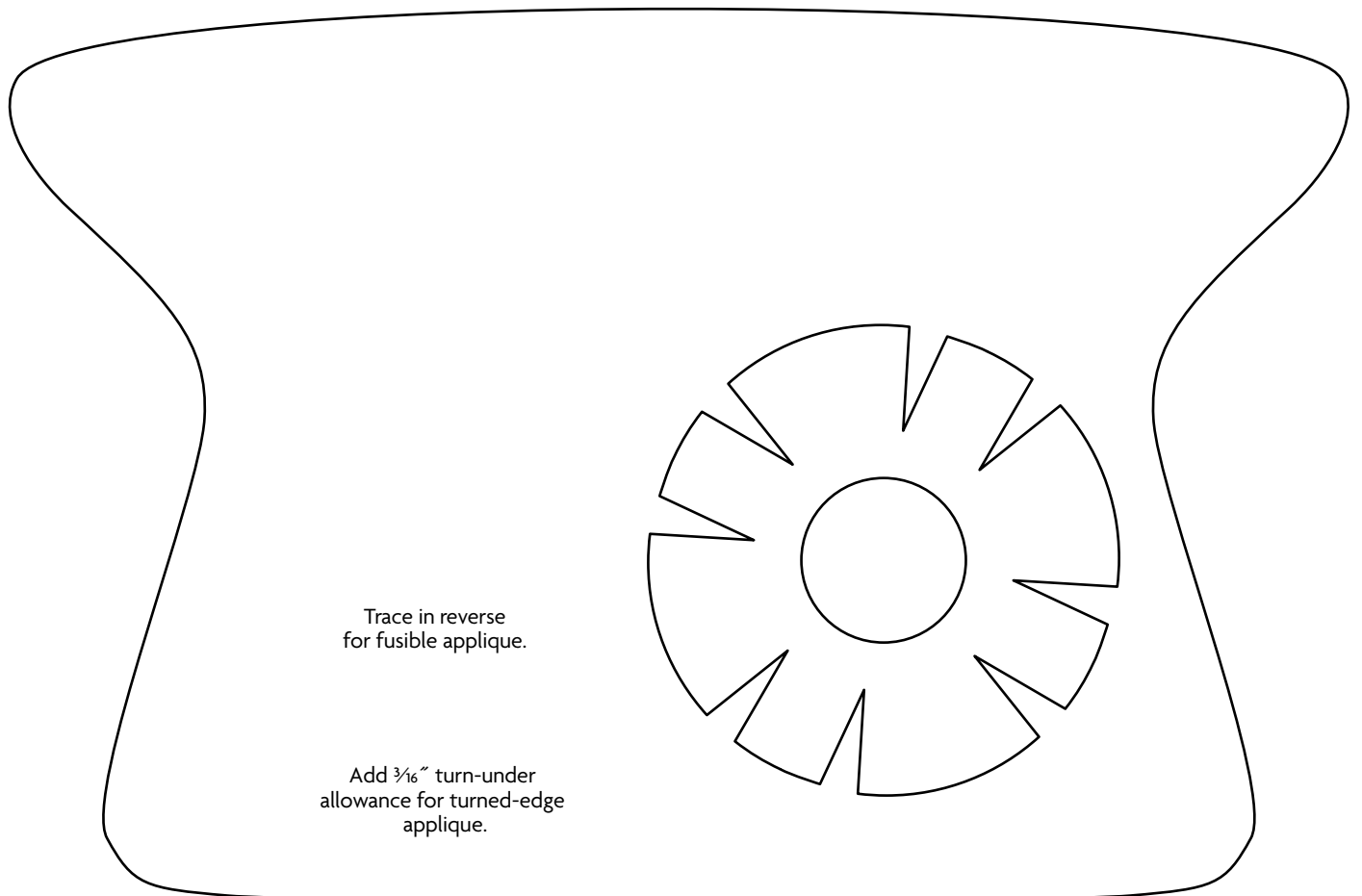


Make sure your printer is set to 100% or "no scaling" before you print your pdf.

12" Block

This block appeared as an appliqued and quilted pillow on the cover of the very first issue of *Quilters Newsletter* in September 1969. Our first issue was a 16-page booklet in black and white, composed on a typewriter and stapled together, and cost 35 cents. Inside the issue, *Moon Flowers* was advertised as a brand-new and exclusive pattern suitable for machine or hand applique. We've come a long way since then, but one thing that hasn't changed is our love for all things quilting and our dedication to providing beautiful, appealing patterns for all quilters – traditional, modern and everywhere in between. 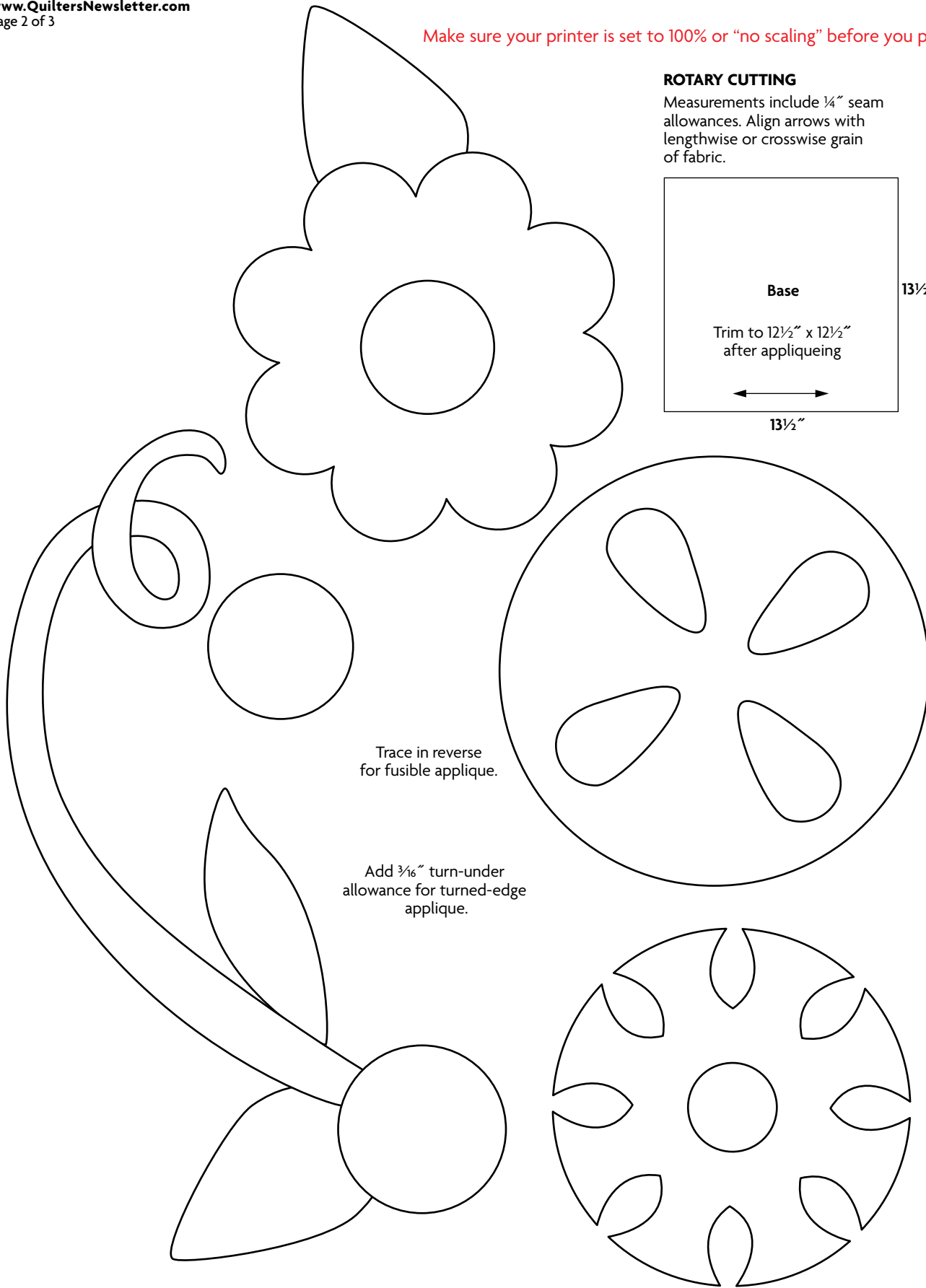
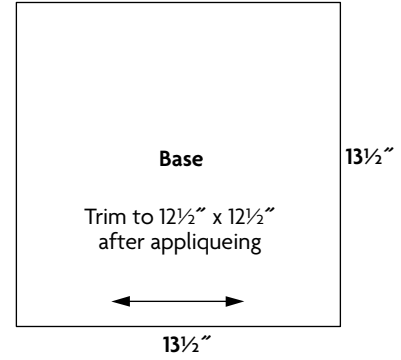
Trace in reverse
for fusible applique.

Add $\frac{3}{16}$ " turn-under
allowance for turned-edge
applique.

Make sure your printer is set to 100% or "no scaling" before you print your pdf.

ROTARY CUTTING

Measurements include 1/4" seam allowances. Align arrows with lengthwise or crosswise grain of fabric.



Trace in reverse for fusible applique.

Add $\frac{3}{16}"$ turn-under allowance for turned-edge applique.
