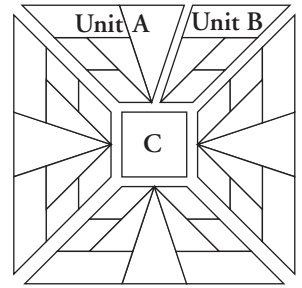


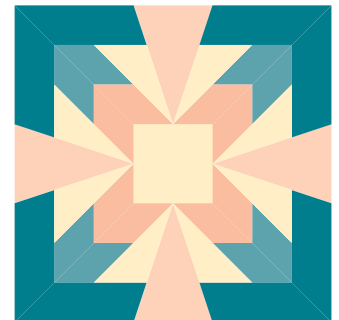
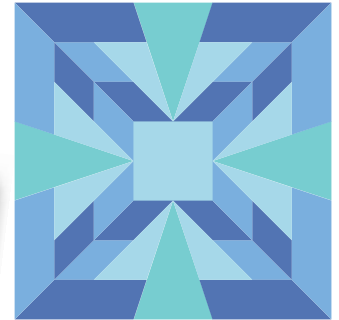
# Just for Fun

Were you a member of the QN Booster Club? Club members were offered a free, limited-edition pattern for the Plain and Fancy block in July 1971 as thanks for selling subscriptions to a publication that was then 32 black-and-white pages. We thought it would be fun to revisit Plain and Fancy, and see if it is possible to construct the 12" block using today's rotary cutting and paper-foundation techniques.

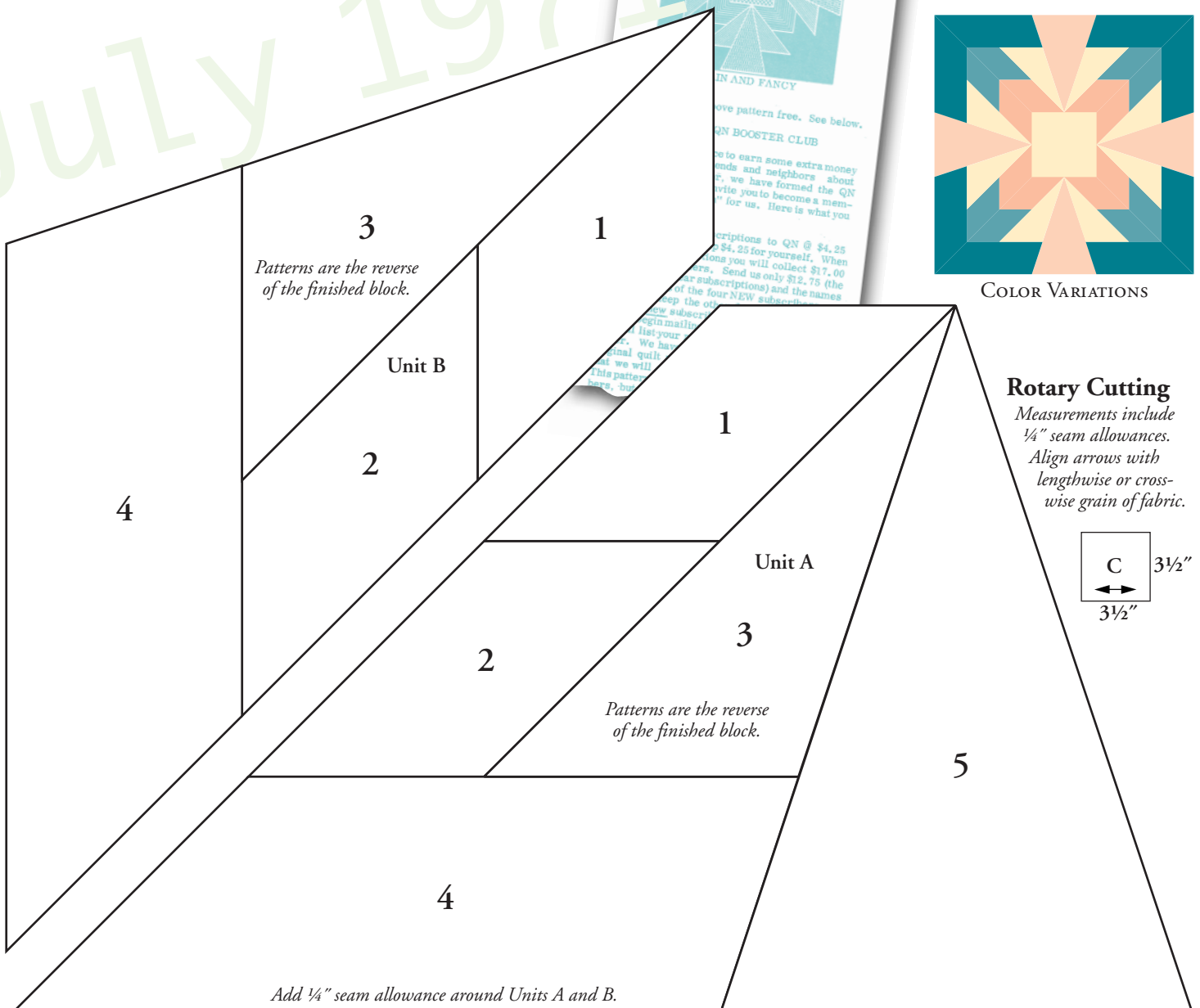
Use paper-foundation-piecing techniques to make 4 unit A and 4 unit B. Cut 1 C, 3½" square. Referring to the block piecing diagram, sew a unit A and a unit B together. Make 4 like this. Sew the C to the short side of an A/B unit, starting and stopping the stitching ¼" from the edges. Similarly, add the remaining units to the C. Complete the block by sewing the diagonal seams.

**Rotary Cutting**  
Measurements include ¼" seam allowances. Align arrows with lengthwise or crosswise grain of fabric.
