## Cutting Instructions

Navy solid
6 rectangles $133 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 181 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

White solid
*18 strips $21 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 151 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
*18 strips $21 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 321 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
*48 squares 2" x $2^{\prime \prime}$
288 Template A
Red solid
*10 strips $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} x$ width of fabric (binding)
*24 strips $21 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 151 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

* 18 strips $21 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 321 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

24 squares $2^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{\prime \prime}$
12 strips 2" x 5"
Light brown solid
6 strips $11 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 231 / 4^{\prime \prime}$
Light blue solid
8 strips 5" x $321 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
3 strips $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 231 / 4^{\prime \prime}$
6 strips $5^{\prime \prime} \times 231 / 4^{\prime \prime}$
*Cut first.

## Piecing the Blocks

1 Note: Navy rectangles are cut oversized to allow for shrinkage during appliqué. Finger-press navy rectangle in half on both length and width; use folds as placement guide. Referring to Diagram I and photos, position 48 stars on rectangle, keeping in mind that rectangle will be trimmed to $123 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 171 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ (finished
 $123 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 171 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.

2 Referring to Diagram II-A, stitch 4 red and 3 white $15 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips together, alternating. Make 6 . In same manner, sew 3 white and 3 red $321 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips together (Diagram II-B). Make 6.

3 Sew pieced rectangles together with appliquéd rectangle to make Flag Block (Diagram III). Make 3 of each arrangement.

4 Referring to Diagram IV, make 12 Red Cross Blocks.

Quilt Top Assembly
Note: Refer to Assembly Diagram for following steps. 5 To make sashing row, sew 3 Red Cross Blocks together with 2 blue $5^{\prime \prime} \times 3212^{\prime \prime}$ strips, alternating. Make 4.
6 To make block row, sew brown strips to long sides of blue $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 231 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ strip. Sew Flag Blocks to sides of pieced strip. Stitch blue $5^{\prime \prime} \times 231 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ strips to sides. Make 3.
7 Sew sashing rows and block rows together, alternating.

Quilting and Finishing
8 Layer, baste, and quilt. 3 parallel lines of hand quilting were stitched on each stripe. The stars, navy rectangles, and brown strips were outline stitched. Each Red Cross Block patch was outline stitched, and an additional square of stitching was added to the center of the red strips, to simulate a true nine-patch. Light blue strips were filled with a diamond pattern, with stitching lines $11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ apart.
9 Bind with red solid.
